A comprehensive overview of social psychology with in-depth lectures exploring the history of the field, reviewing major findings and highlighting areas of current research. Focus is on classic studies that have profoundly changed our understanding of human nature and social interaction. Topics include individuals and groups, conformity and obedience, attraction, aggression and prosocial behavior, stress and stress management, judgment and decision-making. |

However, these are not prescriptive activities, tied to specific texts, but instead are deliberately designed as activity frames which can be applied to a variety of written material. Many of the activities can be used at a range of levels and in a variety of teaching contexts: with young learners or adult learners, with small classes or large classes, where a teacher is using a coursebook, or where there is no coursebook. In this way it is hoped that many teachers will find the course useful and very practical. |

In the painting, they will learn in-depth about style, composition and color, all in order to understand and achieve beauty in still life, landscape, portrait, figure, figurative or non-figurative painting. Coursework provides to support both traditional and contemporary approaches to painting. The students, who finished the course will gain knowledge of: various painting styles; the means of expression of painting ("the language "of painting); the main ways to create a painting with different materials and techniques. Evaluation The course ends with an exam. The performance of a task on a certain topic is evaluated. Plovdiv is the second-largest city in Bulgaria with a population of 404,665 inhabitants as of 2015








THE SEVEN HILLS OF PLOVDIV

NEBET TEPE (LOOKOUT HILL)



12th century BC as the ancient Thracian town Evmolpiya and later expanded by Philip of Macedonia. As the town expanded, Nebet Tepe became the citadel of the town's acropolis, the highest point of the three hills.

Plovdiv: our 10 favorite places YOUTH HILL (HILL OF THE SPIRITS)




Dzhendem tepe is the biggest and highest of the seven Plovdiv hills. In ancient times it was called the Mount of the Dryad Nymphs.

The Hill was declared a natural landmark.

AVOSHA /BUNARDZHIKA HILL/

SAHAT HILL (SAHAT TEPE)



The Russian monument is rising on the even part of the hill. It was created in 1881 in honor of the Russian soldiers who died for the Liberation of Bulgaria from the Ottoman Slavery. In 1883 a new big clock from Vienna is installed in the tower and its chime counts out the hours to date.
